

MIA SCHON | BIO



She graduated from the University of Michigan with a degree in Fine Art and Design in 2009. In 2014, Mia made the decision to leave her home in Boston to visit Tel Aviv for three months but quickly fell in love with the city for its vibrant art scene, heart, and soul — and decided to stay.

With a strong affinity for public art and social impact, Mia has made it her mission to spread large colorful mosaics throughout Israel incorporating text, local tiles and recycled materials into her work. She enjoys collaborating and then creating commissioned pieces. Often you can find her out on the street with a hammer in hand working on her latest street art mural. In addition to her public art, Mia teaches small mosaic workshops out of her studio.








